HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION NO. 23

- A CONCURRENT RESOLUTION DECLARING THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI TO 2 BE A BILL OF RIGHTS SANCTUARY STATE.
- 3 WHEREAS, in order to ensure the rights of the citizens of the
- 4 State of Mississippi which are protected by the United States
- 5 Constitution, and the Bill of Rights of that Constitution, which
- 6 reserves the right of the citizens to decide on matters which
- 7 concern their lives, liberty and property in the ordinary course
- 8 of affairs:
- 9 Congress shall make no law respecting an establishment of
- 10 religion, or prohibiting the free exercise thereof; or abridging
- 11 the freedom of speech, or of the press, or the right of the people
- 12 peaceably to assemble; or to petition the government for a redress
- 13 of grievances;
- 14 A well regulated militia, being necessary to the security of
- 15 a free state, and the right of the people to keep and bear arms,
- 16 shall not be infringed;

- No soldier shall, in time of peace, be quartered in any house
- 18 without the consent of the owner, nor in time of war, except in a
- 19 manner to be prescribed by law;
- The right of the people to secure in his or her persons,
- 21 houses, papers and effects against unreasonable searches and
- 22 seizures shall not be violated, and no warrants shall issue, but
- 23 upon probable cause, supported by oath or affirmation, and
- 24 particularly describing the place to be searched, and persons or
- 25 things to be seized;
- No person shall be held to answer for a capital, or infamous
- 27 crime, unless on a presentment or indictment of a grand jury,
- 28 except in cases arising in the land or naval forces, or in a
- 29 militia, when in actual service in time of war or public danger;
- 30 nor shall any person be subject for the same offence to be twice
- 31 put in jeopardy of life or limb; nor shall be compelled in any
- 32 criminal case to be a witness against himself; nor be deprived of
- 33 life, liberty, or property, without due process of law; nor shall
- 34 private property be taken for public use without just
- 35 compensation;

- In all criminal prosecutions, the accused shall enjoy the
- 37 right to a speedy and public trial by an impartial jury of the
- 38 state and district wherein the crime shall have been committed,
- 39 which shall have been previously ascertained by law; to be
- 40 informed of the nature and cause of the accusation; to be
- 41 confronted with the witnesses against him or her; to have

- 42 compulsory process for obtaining witnesses in his or her favor;
- 43 and to have the assistance of counsel for his or her defense;
- In lawsuits at common law, where the value in controversy 44
- shall exceed twenty dollars, the right of trial by jury shall be 45
- 46 preserved, and no fact tried by a jury shall be otherwise
- 47 re-examined in any court of the United States, except according to
- the rules of common law; 48
- Excessive bail shall not be required, nor excessive fines 49
- 50 imposed, nor cruel and unusual punishments inflicted;
- The enumeration in the Constitution of the United States of 51
- 52 certain rights shall not be construed to deny or disparage others
- 53 retained by the people; and
- 54 The powers not delegated to the United States by the
- constitution, nor prohibited by it to the states, are reserved to 55
- the states respectively, or to the people; and 56
- 57 WHEREAS, The Legislature finds that Section 1 of the
- 58 Fourteenth Amendment to the Constitution of the United States
- declares that all persons born or naturalized in the United 59
- 60 States, and subject to the jurisdiction thereof, are citizens of
- 61 the United States and of the state wherein they reside, and no
- 62 state shall make or enforce any law which shall abridge the
- 63 privileges or immunities of citizens of the United States; nor
- shall any state deprive any person of life, liberty, or property, 64
- 65 without due process of law; nor deny to any person within its
- jurisdiction the equal protection of the laws; and 66

- 67 WHEREAS, the right of the people is further protected from
- 68 infringement by state, federal and local governments under the
- 69 Ninth, Tenth, and Fourteenth amendments to the Constitution of the
- 70 United States; and
- 71 WHEREAS, notwithstanding any law, regulation, rule or order
- 72 to the contrary, no agent, department, employee or official of the
- 73 State of Mississippi or political subdivision thereof, while
- 74 acting in his or her official capacity, shall knowingly and
- 75 willingly, participate in any way in the enforcement of any
- 76 unlawful or unconstitutional act, as defined in this resolution,
- 77 regarding freedom of religion, freedom of speech, freedom of the
- 78 people to peaceably assemble, freedom of the press, freedom to
- 79 petition the government for a redress of grievances, or the right
- 80 of the people to keep and bear arms; and
- WHEREAS, as used in this resolution, an "unlawful act" means
- 82 any federal, state or local act, law, order, rule, or regulation,
- 83 which restricts an individual's constitutional rights, and shall
- 84 include, but not be limited to, the following:
- 85 (a) Any tax, levy, fee, or stamp imposed on firearms,
- 86 firearm accessories, or ammunition not common to all other goods
- 87 and services on the purchase or ownership of those items by
- 88 citizens;
- 89 (b) Any registration or tracking of firearms, firearm
- 90 accessories, or ammunition;

- 93 (d) Any act forbidding the possession, manner of carry,

- 96 (e) Any act ordering the confiscation of firearms, firearm
- 97 accessories, or ammunition from citizens;
- 98 (f) Any prohibition, regulation, and or use restriction
- 99 related to ownership or the constitutionally guaranteed lawful use
- 100 or carry of firearms;
- 101 (q) Any use of state funds or funds given to the state by
- 102 any entity, to participate in a "gun buyback" program or event;

- 104 (h) Any use of state funds given to the state by any entity
- 105 that has violated an individual's rights as outlined in the Bill
- 106 of Rights; and
- 107 WHEREAS, the right to bear arms protection, as provided to
- 108 citizens by this resolution, does not apply to persons who have
- 109 been convicted of felony crimes, and this resolution is not
- 110 intended to prohibit or affect in any way the prosecution of any
- 111 crime for which the use of, or possession of, a firearm is an
- 112 aggravating factor or enhancement to an otherwise independent
- 113 crime, unless such crimes have been expunded by order of a court
- 114 of competent jurisdiction; and

115	WHEREAS, the provisions of this resolution are hereby
116	declared to be severable, and if any provision of this resolution
117	or the application of such provision to any person or circumstance
118	is declared invalid for any reason, such declaration shall not
119	affect the validity of the remaining portions of this resolution;

121	WHEREAS, the Legislature finds that the citizens of the State
122	of Mississippi have taken notice and voiced concerns for their
123	rights under the United States Constitution and Bill of Rights,
124	therefore, an emergency is declared to exist in the State of
125	Mississippi; and
126	WHEREAS, the State of Mississippi has the right to be free
127	from the commanding hand of the state and federal government, to
128	refuse to cooperate with state and federal government officials in
129	response to unconstitutional state and federal government
130	measures, and to proclaim a Bill of Rights sanctuary for
131	law-abiding citizens in the State of Mississippi; and
132	NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF
133	REPRESENTATIVES OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI, THE SENATE CONCURRING
134	THEREIN, That we do hereby declare the State of Mississippi to be
135	a Bill of Rights Sanctuary State.
