
We are so blessed to have access to such comprehensive resources that it is easier than ever to comply with 2 Timothy 2:15 'Do your best to present yourself to God as one approved, a workman who does not need to be ashamed and who correctly handles the word of truth'.

Here are the 5 free online Bible-study sites that I consult most frequently. The only major flaw common to all of them is that they feature only public domain commentaries. However, many of the old commentaries are very good although they tend to be weighted towards Reformed theology.

All 5 resources offer similar facilities but there user interfaces, layouts, and ease of use differ.

1. www.biblestudytools.com

At first glance, this site seems unimpressive, but don't be fooled. Just click on the tabs at the top and the site reveals its depth and range. I could not find either an android or iPhone app for this resource.



2. www.Studylight.org

This resource has a lot to offer, ranging from 107 commentaries and 27 dictionaries, through original language tools, to devotionals and reading plans.



3. www.Biblehub.com


As with most of the Bible study resources available, this one has a somewhat old-fashioned layout and rudimentary user interface. But, once again, it has a big range of tools on offer and it also has a free Android or iPhone app. A major feature is its parallel bible that compares any verse in about twenty different translations. http://biblehub.com/app.htm

4. www.Biblegateway.com

This site has an excellent search feature, and it also has audio-bible facilities, as well as android and iPhone apps.



5. www.Blueletterbible.org

A major feature of this resource is its search engine for words, lexicons, and theological topics. It has a good selection of bible translations, reference works, commentaries, and so on. It also has Android and iPhone apps.

If I had to choose just one of these 5 resources I would opt for the blueletterbible. It has not been commercialised, it has great search facilities, original language tools, an excellent copy to clipboard facility, and an excellent range of bibles, commentaries, and reference tools.
